THE ROUTE TO QUALIFICATION

**Part 1**  
University undergraduate degree (e.g. BA or BSc). Three years full-time (or over a total range of skills and architectural understanding). You are eligible for the first Student Membership for your first year of study.



**Stage 1**  
Practical Experience

Part practical experience - usually one year in duration. You will work for a company or organization in the industry. The PEPA is monitored by a Student Advisor at your University, and you will receive support from them.

PEPA provides a platform for students and employers on the PEPA website, and encourages students to gain experience where under the supervision of an architect or another qualified construction industry professional at the stage.

Some students choose to work longer than the year - to see more in person or to gain a wider range of professional experience. Some students also time to work in the construction industry to gain a wider range of experience.

## Part 2

University degree - with focus on a relevant field (e.g. Design, BIM). The year full-time (or over a total range of skills and architectural understanding). You are eligible for the first Student Membership for your first year of study.

## What are the entry requirements?

Students of Architecture will usually require the following entry requirements: GCSEs (or equivalent) in Mathematics and English, and a minimum of 12 UCAS points. It is essential that you have a portfolio of work that demonstrates your ability in drawing, design, and creative problem-solving. Some universities also require a qualification in art or design.
